National Incident Command System ICS 300 Intermediate Incident Command October 27/28/29, 2015

This 3-day course covers:

- ICS Staffing and organization to include: reporting and working relationships and information flow.
- Transfer of Command
- Unified Command functions in a multi-jurisdictional or multi-agency incident
- ICS forms
- Resource Management
- Interagency mission planning and procurement

Who should take it:

According to FEMA, mid-level management government & nongovernmental personnel, including:

Persons serving as command staff, section chiefs, strike team & task force leaders, unit leaders, division/group supervisors, branch directors, and multi-agency coordination system/emergency operations center staff

Only those persons who have completed ICS 100, ICS 200, and ICS 700 will be accepted to this class

Cost: All courses are offered at no charge to participants

This training is funded by the Humboldt County DHHS Public Health Emergency Preparedness grant. There is no cost to participants for tuition, course materials, or BRN/EMS Continuing Education credits.
